O4. Personal Data Protection Bill likely to be tabled in Parliament in Budget session

New Delhi: *The Personal Data Protection Bill*, which proposes to put restriction on use of personal data without explicit consent of citizens, is likely to be tabled in the next year's Budget session of *Parliament*, according to a source.
